# Section A Reading Comprehension (20 Marks)

The experience is humbling and it makes us wiser. That is, if every mistake is regarded as an experience and not as a source of self condemnation. Many times people are unable to reconcile with the change grooved in the blame culture and rooted in the past, they had to realize the life time benefits they receive from changes.
- 4. Nature abounds in examples of flexibility and relocation in case of birds and beasts. Scientific research in the behavior of birds has confirmed these Birds, animals and even nomads, travel miles and miles in search of better food, congenial climate and safety.
