

CADEMICS

- 1. The school follows the guidelines of CBSE and NCERT in terms of curriculum, examination and evaluation methods.
- 2. Session: The academic session begins from the 2nd/3rdweek of March every year.
- 3. The Medium of Instruction is English.
- 4. Schedule for the Examination:

The assessments / periodic tests are very important and compulsory. Hence, the school conducts assessment / tests in the subjects as per schedule published in the school diary. The school does not re-conduct any assessment / test separately for any student under any circumstance and no request for the same from the Parents / students is entertained, except under exceptional circumstances.

The result of Annual Examination/Assessment for classes Nursery-IX and XI is declared in the first/second week of March. The dates for Final Assessment / Examination & declaration of results for classes X & XII are as per the directives of the CBSE.



- a. For classes Nursery & KG: The students are assessed on the basis of their quality of performance in various domains / day-to-day activities conducted by the school.
- b. For classes I III: Grades are awarded to the students. No marks and ranks are awarded nor reflected in the Progress Report. Effort grades are awarded exclusively on the basis of their performance in Periodic Tests.
- c. For classes IV & V: Promotion to the next higher class is granted on review of the overall performance of the students in the whole academic year as per the guidelines of CBSE.
- d. For classes VI-IX: Promotion to the next higher class is on the basis of Periodic Tests as per the guidelines of CBSE.
- e. For class XI: Promotion of the students of class XI to their next higher class is considered on the whole year's academic performance, as per the guidelines issued by CBSE.
- f. For Classes X & XII: The final Board examination is conducted by the CBSE.
- g. Criteria for exemption: Exemption from any assessment / tests are granted to such students who represent the school at the state/national levels of different games and co-curricular activities with due approval from the Principal.
- 6. Attendance: It is compulsory for every student to complete at least 85% of attendance in an academic year in order to make himself/herself eligible to appear in his/her final examination. Leave on account of illness etc. is also considered as absence for this purpose and no relaxation is granted in such cases.



INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

We have been able to position ourselves among the leading schools in Central India through our quality school education and world class infrastructure facilities. This ensures a homely environment to the students and stimulates professional learning for a global competition. LABORATORIES

SPORTS, GAMES AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES


The school lays special emphasis on various games and sports and co-curricular activities. The students are encouraged to take part in inter house and inter-school competitions.

COUNSELLING SESSIONS

BUS FACILITY

At present, a fleet of 34 buses are plying and it covers almost every area of the city of Raigarh and its suburban areas. Around 3700 students commute daily to the school by buses. It ensures a convenient, safe, reliable and friendly mode of transport for the students.

- # Carrying identity card-cum-bus pass is compulsory to board the bus.
- # Pick-up and drop only at designated/approved bus stoppages.
- # The school reserves the right to prescribe / change the bus routes as and when needed.
- # If any student is found availing bus facility without identity card and/or not making regular payment of bus fees, the same will be treated as a gross indiscipline and the concerned student may be charged with bus fees for the entire session and strict disciplinary actions may be taken against him/her.
- # Bullying in any form is strictly prohibited inside the school buses and if any student is found involved in such acts, action deemed fit will be taken.





- 1. Age as on 31st March of the Academic Session: Class Nursery: 3 to 4 yrs; Class KG-I: 4 to 5 yrs; Class KG-II: 5 to 6 yrs; Class 1:6 to 7 yrs.
- 2. Submit the duly filled-in application form along with the requisite fee on or before the last date. (Incomplete application forms will not be processed).
- 3. Mere registration does not guarantee admission.
- 4. Please preserve the Prospectus, Registration fee receipt till the admission formalities are completed.
- 5. Criteria for admissions (subject to availability of seats) based on: III-V
 - For class Nursery: lottery draw on stipulated date.
 - For classes KG VIII: Interaction
 - For classes IX & XI: Admission Test & Interaction.
- The Winter dates will be notified through the Circular/School Website. 6. The list of successful candidates will be declared through our School's website (will also be displayed in the school's Notice Board).
- 7. The selected students have to complete all admission related formalities, including deposit of requisite fee, within the schedule published, failing which the admission stands cancelled.
- 8. Submission of Documents & formalities to be completed at the time of Admission.
 - Attested copy of Birth Certificate (Classes NUR, KG & I).
 - Original TC (Classes II to XII).
 - Caste Certificate, if any.
 - Vaccination record of the Child.
 - Previous year's Mark sheet or Progress Report (Classes II to XII).
 - Identity Card of the Parent (If JSP / JP / NSP employee).
 - Photographs (2 of student, 1 each PPP of mother & father).
 - Deposit of requisite fee on the specified date & time.
 - Submit a copy of Aadhaar Card of the aspiring student seeking admission.
 - CBSE Registration Card (applicable from class IX onwards; if already registered with CBSE).
 - If transferred & appeared in Assessments/Tests at previous school, mark sheet/mark statement/report is a must.
- 9. As per the directives of the CBSE, the authenticity of the Transfer Certificate will be verified through the website of the previous school, failing which the admission will be treated as provisional. In such cases, the parents must take necessary action to ensure the authenticity of the TC.

Summer Uniform (April - October) On Mon, Tue, Thu & Fri:

Girls: Class Nursery: Red and blue checks tunic with half sleeved light blue shirt. Classes KG-VIII: Dark steel grey, pleated tunic with half sleeved prescribed check-shirt. Classes IX-XII: Dark steel grey divided-skirt, half-sleeved prescribed check-shirt.

Boys: Class Nursery: Red and blue checks pant with half sleeved light blue shirt. Classes KG-VIII: Dark steel grey half-pant with half-sleeved prescribed check-shirt. Classes IX-XII: Dark steel grey full-pant with half-sleeved prescribed check-shirt.

Shoes & Socks for both Boys & Girls:

Classes KG-III: Campus Trendz Velcro Black shoe, dark steel grey socks with white strips. Classes IV-XII: Rakshak/Campus Trendz Black shoes with laces, dark steel grey socks with white strips.

On Wed & Sat:

Girls: Class Nursery: Dark blue lower with T-Shirt.

Classes KG-VIII: White pleated tunic, white half-sleeved prescribed shirt. Classes IX-XII: White salwar-kameez, prescribed half jacket.

Boys: Class Nursery: Dark blue lower with T-Shirt

Classes KG-VIII: White half-pants, white half-sleeved shirt.

Classes IX-XII: White full-pants, white half-sleeved shirts.

Shoes & Socks for both Boys & Girls:

Class Nursery - Campus Trendz Velcro Black Shoes with Dark Blue Socks. Classes KG-III: Campus Trendz Velcro Black Shoes with white socks. Classes IV-XII: Rakshak/Campus Black Shoes with laces along with white socks.

On all days: School tie (House-wise) and prescribed belt.

I-Card: Cl. Nur.II - Dark Blue tag, Cl. III-V - Red tag, Cl. VI-VIII-Blue Tag, Cl. IX & X- Green Tag, Cl. XI & XII- Yellow Tag

Hair style: No fancy hair-style for both Boys & Girls.

Girls: Hair must be fastened with dark steel-grey/black hairband/ribbons in one/two pony-tails/plaits.

Boys: Must put on simple gentle-man hairstyle.


- ♦ Class Nursery: * Blue colour Hoode sweat coat.
- ♦ Classes KG to V: * Sleeveless V-neck sweaters/pullovers of dark steel grey colour. * Wearing sweater is compulsory w.e.f. 1st working day of December.
- ♦ Classes VI to XII : Sleeveless V-neck sweaters of dark steel grey colour or two buttoned blazers of navy blue colour or both, if required.
- Full pants w.e.f. first working day of November for Boys.
- ♦ Long leggings/tights/woolen socks w.e.f. first working day of November for Girls.
- Wearing blazers and sweaters is compulsory w.e.f. first working day of December.

Other Information

- 1. Whenever a student visits the school alone/ with parents for whatsoever the reason may be, he/she must be in school uniform.
- 2. If any student(s) will be seen getting involved in any form of indisciplined activity anywhere inside / outside the premises of the school during/beyond the school hours in school uniform, action deemed proper will be taken against him/ her/them.
- 3. The frames of the spectacles should be either brown or black or metallics; over designed and fancy frames are not allowed.
- 4. The Sikh boys are allowed to wear white Turban/Patka and Kada in addition to those mentioned above.
- 5. It is essential that the pullovers, blazers, sweaters etc are labeled inside with the name of the user.



Student's Almanac: Student's Almanac is a very important record wherein the calender of the academic year comprising tests/examinations, activities, holidays and important dates of various functions are given along with all the rules and regulations to be followed.
