REPORT

To observe International Day for Monuments and Sites, O.P. Jindal School Raigarh, conducted Nature camps to explore the forests of Dudhwa Tiger Reserves under the Flagship of INTERNATIONAL AWARD FOR YOUNG PEOPLE. In order to fulfill the IAYP adventurous journey, the teachers along with 24 participants of bronze, silver and gold level, organized 3 days camp at Dudhwa national park. The camp to Dudhwa Tiger Reserve, which was of 3 days ie from 9th to 12th March, 2018 comprised of 26 enthusiastic learners and a group of 3 teachers.

After reaching Lucknow, the 1st group travelled about 200 km to reach the dense forest of Dudhwa. They explored the length and breadth of the forest and the teachers were busy in quenching the thirst of curiosity of the young learners.

During all the three days, some challenging activities were done by the students. The activities were done team wise and the winner got medals and a trophy.

Day One.....1) Parakram dare- In this, the students had developed a trap for the Maoist where one team acted as an army and the other two teams as Maoists.

2) Hero no 1 of the forest dare- In the next half, another group of hero no 1 was given a role to play.

Day Two.....1)Sal and Pal dare (Safari to the forest)– In this, the students were asked to collect some species of plants like algae, climbers, creepers and trees commonly found in the forest of Dudhwa and present a presentation on it.

2) Survival instinct-In this, the students were taken to the forest with very limited resources and were asked to make a tent, a fire to cook maggi, weapons to scare the man eater and a trap to catch it.

3) A camp fire ,a documentary movie and a fun game of tug of war was the next activity.

4) Dare Devils- In this, the students were asked to find out the betal in dark street of the camp area.

Day three.....1) Closing Ceremony followed by prize distribution.

Report: Community based Health Awareness Programme

- Date** - 22nd July 2017
- Venue** - Three villages (Kerajhar, Dongadhakel & Muraripali)
- Purpose** - To educate the villagers about the measures to be adopted to prevent diarrhoea

Community engagement educational projects often called “service learning,” are ones that combine learning goals and community service to enhance student growth as well as common good. It is a teaching- learning strategy that integrates meaningful community service with classroom instruction to teach students about civic responsibility and strengthens their sense of commitment towards the development of the community.

Keeping these aspects in view, our school clubs (**Health & Wellness Club, IAYP, NSS & Jr. Red Cross Society**) jointly **organized & conducted a community based health awareness programme in the month of July**. The club members (school doctor, counsellor, teachers & students in classes IX-XI) visited three villages (**Kerajhar, Dongadhakel & Muraripali**) in the vicinity of our school. The purpose of this program was **to generate awareness** among the villagers about **prevention of diarrhoea**, which has been found to be one of the leading causes of death affecting children in poor condition particularly during the summer & monsoon months.

The important aspects related to diarrhoea were explained in detail along with informational display in the form of charts ,flakes & slogans focusing upon the following issues:

- **Diarrhoea: its meaning & effects**
- **Causes of diarrhoea**
- **Measures to prevent diarrhoea**
- **First line of treatment**

Hand washing activity

Villagers were also explained about the importance of proper hand washing before having meals & after toilet. In fact, the procedure of hand washing was explained through demonstration. They were also encouraged to stop defecating in the open spaces by building up toilets in their houses.

Overall, the health awareness programme was conducted successfully in all the three villages. The villagers also responded very well by extending their fullest cooperation for the smooth conduct of the programme.

Keeping the above mentioned objectives in mind, the three clubs (Jr. Red Cross Society, I A Y P, Health & Wellness Club) functioning at our school went for a joint venture of community service. The members along with their teachers visited Nilanchal on 20th August 2016. It is a Non Government Organization that provides shelter and education to orphans and children with single parent.

Interaction with the children:

The children residing were thirty eight in number within the age group of 6 years to 18 years. Among them, the middle school students were not available as they were in school writing their examinations. Our students and teachers met and interacted with the children living there. Their daily routine including the food , study habits and other activities were shared with our students. Children were also encouraged to recite poems, dance and sing according to their choice.

Medical Check up

The Jr .Red Cross Society also organized a free medical checkup for the children residing at Neelanchal. Dr. Chandra, pediatrician conducted the medical check-up and identified the students who required medical attention due to specific health issues.

Counseling Program

After the medical checkup, a counseling program was conducted by Mrs. Sujata Banerjee on behalf of Health and Wellness club to inform the students about the following issues:

- Good habits
- Appropriate and inappropriate behaviour patterns
- Personal hygiene

Furthermore, they were motivated to fully utilize the resources available to them through an inspiring story which emphasized upon the lesson that our present actions shape our future.

Distribution of stationary

Following the counseling session, drawing books and colours were distributed by our students to the children . They seemed to be extremely delighted to receive their gifts.

Plantation

The students of our school along with the children residing at Nilanchal together planted several saplings in the open areas surrounding the organization.

Our students as well as the children have enthusiastically participated in all the activities mentioned in this report. We wholeheartedly acknowledge the support and cooperation of our honourable Principal, Administrator, all the Coordinators and teachers in this endeavor.

Report on excursion to KABDA PAHAD, a Mesolithic site conducted by Heritage Club and IAYP.

Venue - KABDA PAHAD

Purpose - To enrich the learning experience with a practical exposure to the Mesolithic sites and also to inculcate the values pertaining to preserve our heritage.

On 26th November, 2016, Heritage Club and IAYP organized a field trip to Kabda Pahad (Mesolithic sites), with an objective to provide a practical exposure to enhance their interest in learning about our glorious past.

Kabra Pahad is situated to the east of Raigarh city. The highland is engulfed by dense deciduous vegetation and it was really worth watching the panorama. The journey to the top of the highland was adventurous for the youngsters as the fragments of rocks were loose and shaky. A guide from the nearby locality led us to the Pre-historic site. It was a great learning experience for the participants.

After about an hour of trek we reached the site and were literally taken aback by the amazing art left behind by our ancestors. Two different colors- red and green, derived from natural vegetation were used to draw those paintings of reptiles and four-footed animals. Social science teachers explained those paintings with relevant datas which included the time period and the type of environment, during pre-historic times. Students were very much surprised and they asked so many questions to quench their thirst of wisdom. It was sad to see that some tourists, who visited there, have tried to destroy that rich cultural asset of the country by writing their names etc. on some of those paintings. It was an unforgettable trip and it would have definitely accentuate the interests of learners to study our past.
