TYPES OF FESTIVALS –

➤ NATIONAL FESTIVAL

National festivals are celebrated all over India. All the citizens of the country celebrate them irrespective of the religion, caste, creed, and sex. Everyone celebrates them with great patriotism.

Independence Day 15th August
Republic Day 26th January

➤ REGIONAL FESTIVAL

Regional festivals are celebrated by the entire nation irrespective of their religion barriers

In North – Dussehra In East – Durga Puja
In West – Navratri In South – Onam

➤ RELIGIOUS FESTIVAL

A religious festival is a time of special importance marked by adherents to that religion. Religious festivals are commonly celebrated on recurring cycles in a calendar year or lunar calendar.

Hindu- Diwali, Holi Christian – Christmas
Muslim – Eid Sikh- Gurupurab

➤ HARVEST FESTIVAL

A harvest festival is a celebration of the food that is grown on the land. It is celebrated to thank God for good crops.

Example – Onam (Kerala), Pongal (Tamilnadu), Bihu (Assam), Baisakhi (Punjab) etc.
